The Coalbed Gas Name Game

NGC, CBG, CMM, CBM or CSM? The acronyms can be confusing but they all describe the same thing: natural gas that is produced from coals.

In Princeton, Petrobank has used natural gas from coal (NGC) when talking about our pilot project in the area. The Canadian Society for Unconventional Gas uses NGC and coalbed methane (CBM) as terms for the process.

In British Columbia, the process is called coalbed gas (CBG) by the provincial government. In the United States, it is sometimes called coalmine methane (CMM) and in Australia, it's called coal seam methane (CSM).

As we continue our work in the community, you may hear different names from a variety of sources. From this point forward, we will consistently use CBG when talking about our project.
